Please review the uniform options below:

For all officers, especially O-5 and above, the Dinner Dress White Jacket (DDWJ), or the Dinner Dress Blue Jacket (DDBJ) is preferred for this formal event. This uniform uses the short, bolero-style jacket in either white for summer, or black for winter.

However, either is fine for this event!



For any officers unable to obtain the DDWJ or the DDBJ in time, you can wear the Dinner Dress Blue (DDB). This consists of the same jacket as your Service Dress Blue, but wear your Mini Medals and NO Name Tag. A common mistake is to wear the long tie, but men must wear a BOW TIE. Badges and Insignia are worn as well. Start working on your mini medals now while you have time! Remember that not all awards have a corresponding mini medal.









For all officers who do not have any mini medals (yet), and who would not be wearing anything at all on the uniform chest (i.e. no name tag and no mini medals), we understand that this may be an awkward or uncomfortable look. Thus, for these and any other officers, we will allow the Service Dress Blue.

Everyone should own this uniform, so please don't let the uniform requirement be a barrier to your attendance!

No ODUs, No Khakis. Remember there is a DJ and Dancing after the dinner; if you choose to change into casual clothes, you are free to do so after the dinner.
